INSTRUCTION PROGRAM FOR REMEDIATION

The Following regulations are recommended to meet the requirements of the Standards of Quality.

Standard 1:C2

The school division will provide a program of prevention, intervention, or remediation for students who are "at risk" including, but not limited to, students whose scores are in the bottom national quartile on VSAPT, or fail any SOL test in grades three, five, and eight.

Annually, at the beginning of the school year, and no later than September 30th, each principal, with assistance from school staff, will develop a list of students considered to be "at risk." For each student listed, a plan of prevention, intervention, or remediation will be developed. The list of students along with the identified program provided for each student will be submitted to the division superintendent for review.

Standard 1:D.1.k

The school division will develop a plan to make achievement for students who are educationally "at risk" a division-wide priority which includes procedures for measuring the progress of such students.

Students listed on the school "at-risk" list will be monitored during the school year by the classroom teacher(s), principal, and guidance for the purpose of determining if the special prevention, intervention, or remediation plan is providing the academic needs of the student. Principals, with the assistance of teachers, will monitor academic progress by comparing test scores, grades, attendance, etc. A summary of progress for each student will be submitted to the division superintendent for review at the end of the school year.

Standard 1:C.3

The school division requires a student who fails <u>all</u> of the SOL tests at grades three, five, and eight to attend summer school or participate in another form of remediation.

Immediately following SOL testing, and no later than July 1st of each year, each principal will identify students who fail <u>all</u> of the SOL tests at grades 3, 5, and 8. These students will be required to attend summer school or participate in another form of remediation. Parents/guardians will be informed of this regulation. This list of students will be submitted to the division superintendent with the description of prevention, intervention, or remediation in which the student will be participating.

Standard 1:C.4

The division superintendent <u>requires</u> any student who passes one or more, but not all, of the SOL assessments in grades 3, 5, and 8 to participate in a special remediation program. Such special program of prevention, intervention, or remediation may include attendance in public summer school programs.

Immediately following receipt of SOL test results, and no later than July 1st of each year, each principal will identify students who fail one or more SOL test in grades 3, 5, and 8. These students will be required to attend summer school or participate in another form of remediation. Parents/guardians will be informed of this regulation. This list of students will be submitted to the division superintendent with the description of prevention, intervention, or remediation in which the student will be participating.
